#### *Cookies and how they benefit you*

Our website uses cookies, as almost all websites do, to help provide you with the best experience we can. Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer or mobile phone when you browse websites

Our cookies help us:

- Make our website work as you'd expect
- Improve the speed/security of the site
- Continuously improve our website for you
- Make our marketing more efficient (ultimately helping us to offer the an effective service)

We do not use cookies to:

- Collect any personally identifiable information (without your express permission)
- Collect any sensitive information (without your express permission)
- Pass data to advertising networks
- Pass personally identifiable data to third parties
- Pay sales commissions

#### *Granting us permission to use cookies*

If the settings on your software that you are using to view this website (your browser) are adjusted to accept cookies we take this, and your continued use of our website, to mean that you are fine with this. Should you wish to remove or not use cookies from our site you can learn how to do this below, however doing so will likely mean that our site will not work as you would expect.

#### *Website Function Cookies*

##### *Our own cookies*

We use cookies to make our website work including:

- Making our shopping basket and checkout work

There is no way to prevent these cookies being set other than to not use our site.

#### *Third party functions*

Our site, like most websites, includes functionality provided by third parties. A common example is an embedded YouTube video and other social media service providers. Our site includes the following which use cookies:

- YouTube - powers the videos on the site
- E-junkie – powers the e-shopping cart on the site
- LinkedIn – part of the social media suite in use
- Twitter – part of the social media suite in use
- Wordpress.com - part of the social media suite in use

Disabling these cookies will likely break the functions offered by these third parties

### *Visitor Statistics Cookies*

We use cookies to compile visitor statistics such as how many people have visited our website, what type of technology they are using (e.g. Mac or Windows which helps to identify when our site isn't working as it should for particular technologies), how long they spend on the site, what page they look at etc. This helps us to continuously improve our website. These so called analytic programs also tell us how people reached this site (e.g. from a search engine) and whether they have been here before helping us to put more money into developing our services for you instead of marketing spend.

We use those provided via our website host and developer, [Immediasite Ltd](#) and these cookies expire when a session ends, i.e. when you close your browser:

Aspsessionid - When you open your web browser and visit a website created by Immediasite, your browser will create a new session cookie which is used to identify you as a user between page loads.

VisitorID - This is an automatically generated ID number which is used to count the number of pages visited by the user on a particular website.

Cat\_ID - This identifies which page of the website you are on, and is used to populate the page with appropriate content from the database.

Cat\_ID\_Nav - This identifies which page of the website you are on within the navigation structure of the website. It is used to control such things as button colours in the navigation bar.

ThisNav and ClickNav - These cookies are used to store a 'crumb line' of previously visited pages so that the user can see where they are within the navigation structure of the website.

arrSID - This is used to store a querystring as a cookie. A querystring is a piece of code that appears in the address bar and is deleted when a new page is loaded. This cookie allows querystring information to be passed across multiple pages.

PageNo - This records the Cat\_ID of the websites home page. It is used in conjunction with the arrSID cookie to store a querystring.

### *Turning Cookies Off*

You can usually switch cookies off by adjusting your browser settings to stop it from accepting cookies (Learn how [here](#)). Doing so however will likely limit the functionality of ours and a large proportion of the world's websites as cookies are a standard part of most modern websites

It may be that your concerns around cookies relate to so called "spyware". Rather than switching off cookies in your browser you may find that anti-spyware software achieves the same objective by automatically deleting cookies considered to be invasive.
